### 2 To connect the Community to Christ

The Congregational imperative is to do the Mission of God. We strive to achieve this. Members are concerned and engaged in mission locally, nationally and globally eg Christmas Bowl appeal, YouthCare, UnitingCare, Fremantle homeless support.

In recent years, there have been three factors impacting the implementation of our Mission plan. That is, the prospect of rebuilding and repurposing our building, COVID and not having an established minister. In 2023 we reignited our Mission Plan. Our vision and missional goals have not changed, but we have reviewed our actual and proposed missional activities. We are keen to implement some new and innovative missional activities, but to set realistic goals around implementation.

To this end, the Mission Group met earlier this year and established some priorities for new activities in order to meet our missional goals.

We decided to establish an evening where people who are homeless or struggling financially are invited to our church for a soup and laundry evening once a week. We are in the process of organizing this to commence in June 2023. We are still in negotiations with <a href="Orange Sky Australia">Orange Sky Australia</a> to provide a laundry service at our Church. They have indicated that they have availability on some nights.

## 3 To better equip our members in leadership

- Continue to develop "Pastoral Partners" through training, equipping members for the use of their spiritual gifts
- Continue to develop Elders
- Continue to develop volunteers within existing groups at WUC
- Identify and encourage potential new leaders
- To consider ways we care for our church leaders and reduce overload.

#### 4 To improve our contact and connection with more people

- Optimizing our Website
- Examine other ways of spreading our message, eg media, community based events, etc
- Equipping members with tools to invite others
- Making visitors welcome before, during and after worship
- Follow up with visitors steps to follow

## **Our Community**

The City of Canning has an increasing population. In 2016, the population of the City of Canning was 93,733 and in 2012 it was 95,860.

The local population is increasingly multicultural. The largest growing cultural groups are Chinese and Indian ancestry.

In the City of Canning 18.5% of the population have Chinese ancestry, compared to 5.8% in the whole Greater Perth area.

8.2% in Canning have Indian ancestry, compared to 3.5% in Greater Perth.

1.4% of the population are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.\*

#### **Our Priorities**

The mission group was established because we recognised a need to plan a way to use our resources differently and reach out to the community in innovative and fresh ways.

There has been some great progress made in identifying what we currently do and considering new ways of reaching out to the community. We have a fledgling community of **youth** – school age to young adults - and want to engage and inspire them. We also need to respond to the evolving community, with its increasing **age** and **diversity**.

## **Imperatives**

In order to take into account our people resources, we are focusing on one new missional activity at a time.

We decided to establish an evening where people who are homeless or struggling financially are invited to our church for a soup and laundry evening once a week. We are in the process of organizing this to commence in June 2023. We are currently finalizing negotiations with Orange Sky Australia to provide a laundry service at our Church. Orange Sky is a charity provided to homeless and low-income people which has the aim of providing a positive connection through a portable laundry service. They have indicated that they have availability on some nights. We have many volunteers mobilized to make soup.

We are hoping to commence this initiative in June 2023.

Once this initiative is established, we will identify another action to work on. Other priorities established this year include revisiting Messy Church and continuing with the Annual Fun Fair. We have identified a need to review our **people resources**. Many church activities require a great deal of input by our members. There is some concern that our human resources could be stretched beyond capacity should we add more projects to the list. It has been very useful to identify this because it has shown us that changing our paradigm about the way we do things is crucial.
