A word on the WORD

Jesus typically calls busy folks. He was not known for recruiting slackers. Throughout the scriptures he comes upon people in the daily routines of their lives and calls them to discipleship. In Matthew 4:18-20 he calls the first four disciples—Peter and Andrew while they were casting a net into the sea, and James and John in the boat with their father mending their nets. In Matthew 9:13, Jesus takes the initiative once again and calls Matthew, a toll/tax collector to follow him. Jesus sees him working at a sheltered counting desk, or booth placed strategically near the route out of the area of Galilee where fishermen would transport their catch.¹ Jesus calls people out of the ordinariness of their lives. It is not that they don't have anything else to do, it is that they don't have anything more important to do than to hear and heed the Saviour's command. The call makes a compelling, life-altering claim. It says in effect "Since there is nothing more important for you to do, drop what you are doing and follow me." The most fitting response to such a command is "And he got up and followed him."
