A word on the WORD (Matthew 15:21-28 (Compare Mark 7:24-30)

The story surprises! Would Jesus respond like this? Then as you read it again you will notice that Jesus emphasis that his coming is to call the Jews back on track. They have allowed the LAW to become an end in itself rather than an aid to their faithfulness. What is more is that she is a Gentile and argues her case in public with Jesus. Normally she would have Buckley's chance of success, but she addresses Jesus as Son of David (Matt.) – and she persists. In addressing Jesus as Son of David she is acknowledging Jesus as Messiah! And the Jesus whom we have come to love and follow reveals himself in all his compassion.

The devotional booklet *With Love to the World* makes a powerful comparison with our own Australian First Nation people and raises the question of the forthcoming referendum as to how generous will we be. The risk Jesus takes is enormous – will we be so brave? (Harry Lucas)

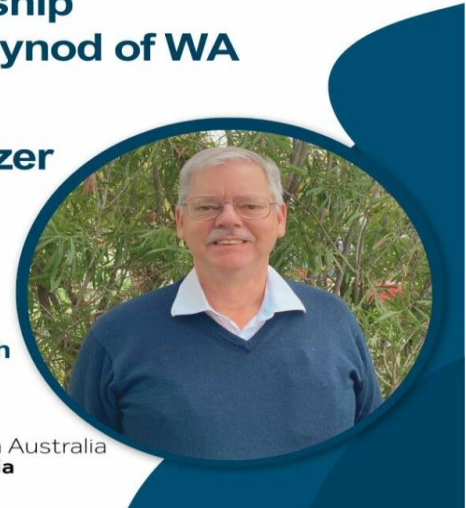
