Purpose/Function of the Church Council:

"The Church Council shall give priority in its life to building up the Congregation in faith and love, sustaining members in hope, and leading the Congregation to a fuller participation in Christ's mission in the world. This priority shall be reflected in the agenda of its ordinary meetings".

(1) Elders and Pastoral Partners:

There was a review of the pastoral care network by the Elders and Pastoral Carers in September. Again, Samuel provided important input into this time, and we also welcomed a new Pastoral Partner in Phyllis Muller to the team. She joins the team of Judy Rowson, Pauline Read, Judy Heath, Muriel Barron, Louise Riedel, Jenny Vermeer, Fran Ciupryk, Sue Heng, Ed Kenny and Pat Whipple.

(2) Ministry:

Since the departure of Rev Mark Bell, we have been blessed with the ministry of Samuel Annan. Samuel has fitted in very well to this congregation and we are appreciative of his work and effort in so many ways. He

has exercised his ministry across the wide range of ministerial responsibilities. Making himself available at the church for both private and small group activities, has been appreciated. His conduct of worship has been exemplary - covering hymns, prayers, reflections, and delightful video clips to make worship relevant and engaging.

Samuel uses the Ghanian image of a hand holding an egg as a model of his leadership-'when pressed too hard it may break and if not held well too, it may break on the ground'. I believe that this has been our experience with Samuel-both as a leader and also holding and nurturing us in prayer and practical support.

As his time with us is drawing to a close and the Advent and Christmas time approaches some community events have been planned -notably on the 17^{th of} December, a Carol service for the community with some fun activities and a sausage sizzle as part of the time. There will also be a congregation Christmas party hosted by the Church Council at the church on the 5^{th of} December. Lots of the specific details will be announced over the coming weeks.

Thanks also to Samuel's family (Rachel, Emelia and Samuel Jr) who have participated in congregational life during their time with us. We wish them all the best as Samuel takes up his role as the minister of the Rockingham Uniting Church.

The future: The Council has had a discussion with Rev Toby Keva who will commence his ministry on the 1st January, 2024. No date had been set yet for his induction by the Presbytery. It was agreed that Toby will continue to live at his house in Shoalwater and continue with his navy chaplaincy role for 1 day a week. He has indicated that the balance of his time will be mostly held at the Herald Avenue site. Again, more specific details of this will be announced over the coming weeks.

Samuel Annan's Ministry Report Nov. 2023

Preamble

Psalm 15

15 LORDS, who can live in your sacred tent? Who can stay on your holy mountain?

Anyone who lives without blame and does what is right.
 They speak the truth from their heart.
 They don't tell lies about other people.
 They don't do wrong to their neighbours.
 They don't say anything bad about them.
 ⁴ They hate evil people.

But they honour those who have respect for the Lord.

They keep their promises even when it hurts.

They do not change their mind.

They lend their money to poor people without charging interest.

They don't accept money to harm those who aren't quilty.

Anyone who lives like that will always be secure.



I have been reflecting on Joshua's leadership and as I do, this psalm and the Ghanaian symbol of a hand holding an egg keeps resonating in my mind. It's a symbol which means that leadership is like a hand holding an egg, when pressed too hard it may break and if not held well too, it may slip and break on the ground. May the good Lord lead us as we serve God's people.

Worship:

Our Sunday worship is based on the Revised Common Lectionary readings. I have been following the uniting church's order of service with combination of contemporary video and activities that is relevant and speak to the theme and the pastoral needs of our congregation. Moreover, in other to create a space for members to pray, I have involved lighting of candles after church, for those who wish to pray after the service to light it and pray for a situation or someone or themselves which has been well received. I usually send out the order of service on Thursdays to all who will be participating in worship: the readers, elder on duty, PowerPoint operators and some individuals their pastoral carers have requested they will need it before services. In addition, some members have requested a copy of my reflection after the service which I send them out on Tuesdays. I will be willing to send both the order of service and the reflection to anyone who may needing a copy as well.

I am very thankful for those who have been volunteering for service; the organists, PowerPoints operators, stewards, readers, elders on Sundays, kitchen team and all our congregation for coming along every Sunday for worship.

Pastoral Care Ministry:

I have been working with the pastoral carers in prayerfully journeying alongside our members who may require such services. Moreover, I have been contacting members on phone upon their permission and willing for such conversations. In addition, I have been spending time on Sunday to check on members after worship and occasionally pray with those who may permit me to do so.

Our communion service is on every first Sunday of the month and I have offered to visit members who may miss the communion and want to be served at their homes.

The office is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, members with pastoral concerns, occasionally visit for a chat and a prayer and will like to encourage others to visit.

Acknowledgement of the Country

Upon the feedback from our members, we resolved that this should be done every first Sunday of the month and it suggests to me that it has been well received by our members.

Church and Office Opening

The Church is open on Thursdays from 10am to 12 noon for prayers. I would like to thank Lyn Muir who helped us to get a placard directing people to our church opening prayers on Thursdays.

The meditation group always light some candles for prayer after their meetings.

Occasionally some members do turn up for prayers. At times some community members visit the church for a chat or wanting a specific need.

CAFE Church and Mission

In recent times I have been prayerfully reflecting on the question: "why are we here as a church in Willetton? In what ways are we contributing to meeting the spiritual needs of our Willetton community?" In collaboration with the mission team, we had this service and had a conversation reflecting on our mission. The members contributed and their feedback are being discussed by the mission team. It is my prayer and hope that, God's Spirit would lead us as we consider these feedbacks together.

Personal Suggestion

I have observed in some meetings relating to church's decision making that before and after the meetings, prayers are not said. I would like to suggest that we encourage prayers before and after meetings. More importantly in relation to seeking for opinions or making a significant decision for our church and on behalf of our members.

Concerning our hymn festival on 19th November, I have suggested to our organists to cancel it. This is because both of our organists who have been involved with the planning contracted COVID and due to the uncertainty of the complications afterwards, I wrote to them to cancel this to enable them to recover. I am planning to use our preparations to have a service of hymns and their meaning on my last worship with Willetton on 31 st December if the church council would agree to that.

INCOME

Offerings - envelope giving lower but higher open plate. Estimate remains similar for 2024. **Church Property** - increased for 2024 in hope we can encourage other groups to use the premises.

Donations - higher than expected for 2023. 2024 adjusted amount.

Bank interest - higher than expected due to rate changes.

EXPENDITURE

Full time placement for 2024.

Miscellaneous – high in 2023 due to purchase of new computer

Insurance – 2022 paid in 2023 (therefore 2 years paid in 2023)

Church Maintenance – 2023 included high expense of roof repair.

Manse Maintenance – included expenses getting ready for private rental.

Manse agent fees – estimated 15% of rental income.

Manse rates & taxes – estimated due to private rental.

Travel & Accommodation – abnormal for 2023 no longer required.

At the time of preparing the Budget for 2024 there were no firm figures for rental of the manse. Hopefully at the meeting these can be confirmed.

Further notes:

Manse: With Mark Bell moving out of the Manse (14 November) there may be additional expenses to bring the property up to standard for private rental. Certainly, there will be some gardening required.

Church: There are always small jobs needing to be done. As a result of water damage in June, work will commence at the beginning of December to have the problems rectified. Approx \$10000. (\$500 dep paid)

We will then talk to the insurers to ensure that the work required to be completed be done as soon as possible.

Approximately \$12300 has been spent on Manse and Church since February.

Property Use: Shapedisability continue to use on a regular basis. Diane has met with CWA branch members who may be interested once a month.

Thank you to all the 'fairies' who assist with the maintenance requirements. There have been long hours put into assisting over the past year. Barbara Bennewith

Subsequent to Café Church, the Mission Group met on 8 November. In attendance were:

We discussed at length the comprehensive feedback received from the congregation and took them into account while discussing the following:

ORANGE SKY PROJECT

Although the congregation remained willing to support this project, Orange Sky has been unable to find enough volunteers, which are crucial to this project.

A DIFFERENT OUTREACH PROJECT?

The mission group discussed the possibility of doing a sandwich and friendship evening instead of the orange sky project. This could be done on a Sunday 4 - 6 and Thursdays after meditation. We need to consider the limitations of the resources of our congregation. We decided to first establish if there was a need. This we would do by:

- 1. Checking social media such as Facebook the I love Willetton page.
- 2. Discussions with the City of Canning
- 3. Local School Chaplains through the Area Chaplain and the local YouthCARE District Council.

Samuel said occasionally people come in during the week asking for help. We decided to set up another box that doesn't go away to St Pats and possibly set up a specific day of the week for those in need of particular items such as toiletries and toilet rolls. This (donations) is something that the congregation identified as a way they could contribute.

Samuel also suggested that shape disability is an opportunity for us to determine what we could also offer in that space. We could join them on one of their Saturdays once in a while for a sausage sizzle and maybe invite the families.

We acknowledge the need to run past the new minister first.

COMMUNITY FUN FAIR
