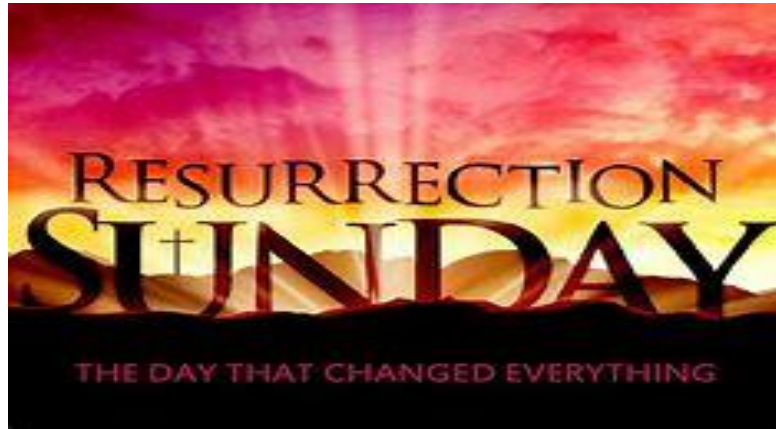

Bible Reading: Mark 11:1-11

Before he came to Jerusalem, Jesus spent most of his time serving people on the countryside. In our reading, he finally reached the capital, Jerusalem, the centre of the Jewish religious, political, and social life. So, his followers rightly expected that Jesus would finally declare himself as a king, establish his new kingdom, overthrow the Romans, and rule from Jerusalem.

Even more: Jesus came during the festival of the Passover when thousands of Jews from all corners of the Roman Empire came to Jerusalem to celebrate the deliverance of their ancestors from slavery in Egypt. There was no better time to start a revolution!

The crowd themselves seemed to affirm Jesus' identity as the new ruler of Israel. They shouted, "Blessed is the kingdom of our father David, which draws closer to us today!" (Mark 11:10 The Voice) The crowd were not only welcoming an ordinary pilgrim; they were welcoming a would-be king!

But their dream was dashed. Jesus did not raise an army or incite people to rebel. And, to put the nails in the coffin of their dream, he was even captured by the Roman authorities that he was supposed to overthrow.

So, the expectation of the crowd on Palm Sunday did not last for long. But it did not last for a good reason: it was misplaced and must be abandoned. But out of the ashes of that shattered dream, something far beyond what people had imagined before was born: **THE RESSURECTION!** **Rev. Toby Keva**

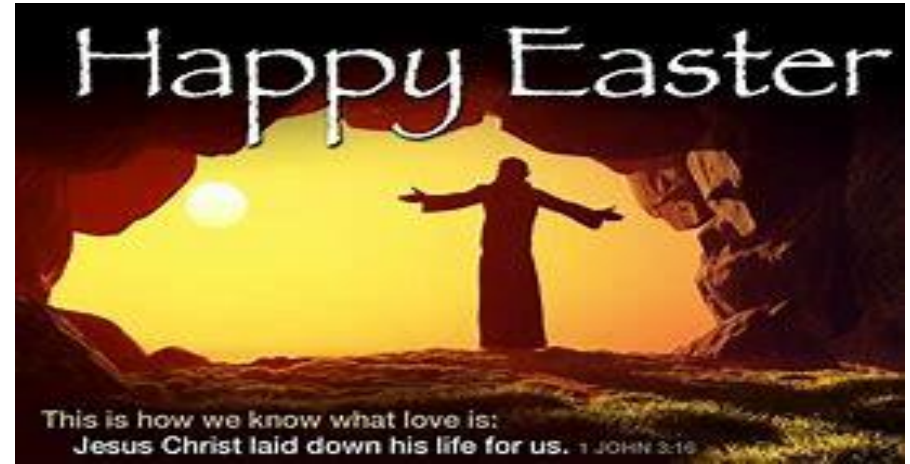

Canning Lodge: The Willetton Church council received an email from the Canning Council that Canning Lodge will be demolished. They have made this decision reluctantly owing to the fact they after extensive search they have not been able to find a private provider to take over the running of the lodge. Work will commence soon and be completed by late April. The site will be temporarily fenced. The land will be sprayed by a hydro mulch allowing grass seed to germinate. The city will then mow the land to keep it tidy and neat. There will be no demolition of the Caprice Place independent living units, the Everglades Day Centre and the Herald Avenue Senior Centre.
