


*Vintage Coffee Group* The group will meet on Wednesday. 24 April, 2.30pm at RAAFA, Bullcreek.

#### Bible Reading: John 24:36-48.

In Luke's Gospel, the risen Jesus was not a supernatural being, like a ghost. No. The risen Jesus was a person. He had a body, could feel hungry, and even asked for fish! Indeed, for Luke and the early followers of Jesus, the resurrection was not only an idea; a metaphysical reality that was hidden behind their eyes. No. For them, the resurrection was something tangible; something they could experience, see, hear, and touch. If Jesus' asking the fish to eat is anything to go by, the resurrection even involves our taste buds! This points to the importance of our physical body and world in the Divine plan for the salvation of the world. If Jesus' resurrection is the foretaste of what God's restoration of all creation will look like, that restoration involves not only our spirit or soul, but also our body and physical world. The Divine is concerned not only about our spiritual well–being, but also our physical well– being. Physical healing and wellbeing indeed take an important place in God's Kingdom that Jesus proclaimed, and that we are to proclaim with our life too.


