Bible Reading: Romans 8:12-17

In the Roman world, there were two ways to be rich: to be *born* into a rich family or to be *adopted* into a rich family. Some Roman Emperors, for examples, rose to the thrones by adoption and not by blood. So being adopted into the right family in the Roman society would completely change the trajectory of a person's life.

It was within this worldview that Paul wrote his letter to the Romans. In this letter, he is making a counter argument against some Jewish Christians who claim that only the Jews can become full members of God's family. But Paul argues that the gentile or non-Jewish believers in Christ are also God's children not by birth, but by adoption (Romans 8:15).

So, we become God's family because God has adopted us. In the words of the Biblical scholar, N. T. Wright, the God that we worship is the God who says to us, "You did not choose me; I chose you." So, none of us become God's child because of our own innate qualities. God has chosen us. And if God wants to adopt all as God's children, who are we to say otherwise.

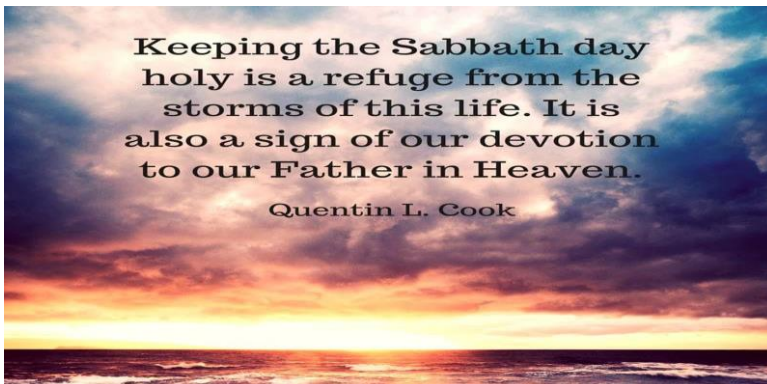

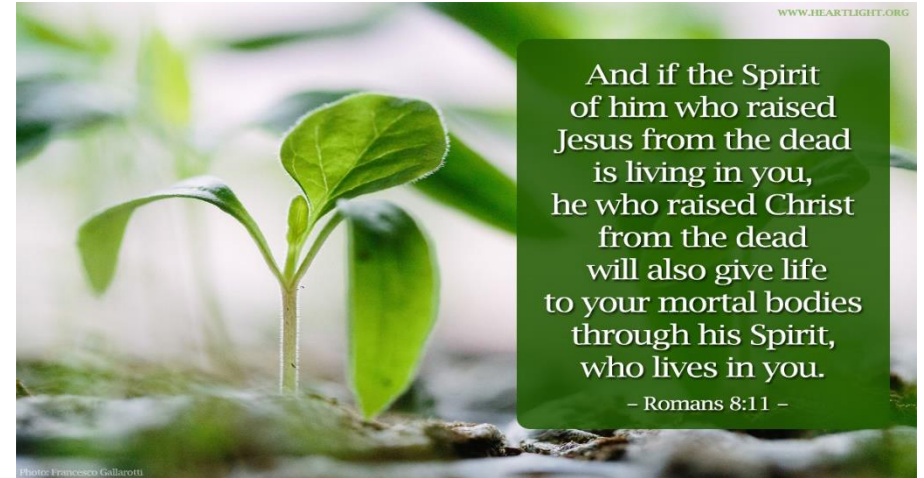
