

Bible Reading: Psalm 23, John 10:11-18, 1 John 3:16-24

I would like to invite you to look at our passage in John's Gospel from a different perspective. What if Jesus was saying not only that he is the good shepherd, but that—like him—we too are the good shepherd. But we are not the good shepherd individually; we can only be the good shepherd together as a community. This is consistent with the understanding of the Church as the body of Christ in Paul's letters. According to Paul, individual Christian is not the body of Christ; only the Church as a community is the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:12, 27).

This means that, as a community, we are to display the characteristics of the good shepherd in Psalm 23 and John 10. The good shepherd leads the sheep to a green pasture and still water. The good shepherd lays down his life to protect the sheep. The good shepherd knows the sheep under his care. The Church can and should also be the place where people find nourishment and wholeness; the place where people feel safe and secure; the place where strangers become known and loved; using the words at the front of our church building, the place where "love and hope make a difference.


