### Bible Reading: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

In ancient time, jars made from clay were the cheapest and most affordable form of containers. These jars, however, were also very fragile. Yet, in some instances, they could stand the test of time. That's why, in many instances, people kept their most important treasure in jars of clay.

This must have been what Paul had in mind when he wrote his second letter to the Corinthians. Paul was responding to some people in the Church whom he called as the 'super-apostles': people who claimed moral and spiritual superiority over other Christians and forced others to emulate them.

But Paul presented himself differently. In his letter, instead of presenting himself as someone who had it altogether, he presented himself like a jar of clay: a fragile being whom had somehow been called by God to take a divine task. We too are all like jars of clay that are fragile and can get easily broken, yet are tasked to carry heavenly and wonderful treasure that we are to pass on to the people around us and to the next generations.

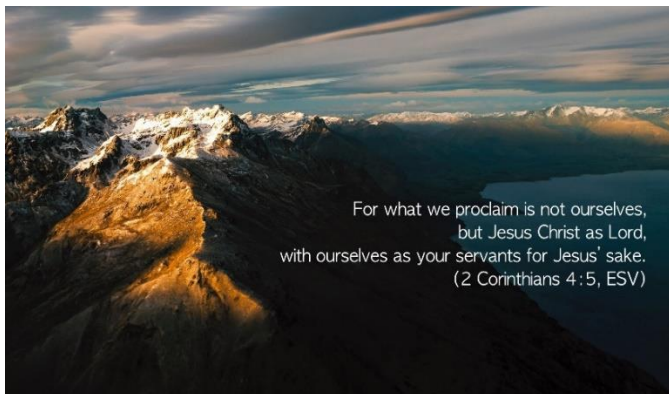
