Bible Reading: Mark 4:26-34

The Kingdom of God does not begin with a lofty idea or a grand enterprise. Jesus says that God’s Kingdom begins with something very small. In his parable, God’s Kingdom begins with the smallest of all seeds. But once it is planted, it has the potential to grow into the biggest of all shrubs. God’s Kingdom that Jesus proclaims is available to everyone. It is an inclusive, not an exclusive kingdom. Through his parable, Jesus wants to point out that anyone can enter God’s Kingdom with something as accessible and affordable as a mustard seed.

In other words, to be qualified to enter God’s Kingdom, we do not need a big capital; we can always start with something small. Mother Theresa of Calcutta, India—one of the most influential persons in 20th century—once said, “Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love.” Likewise, our role is to take that small step of planting the seed of the good news of Jesus Christ and nurture it. God is the one who will grow it.

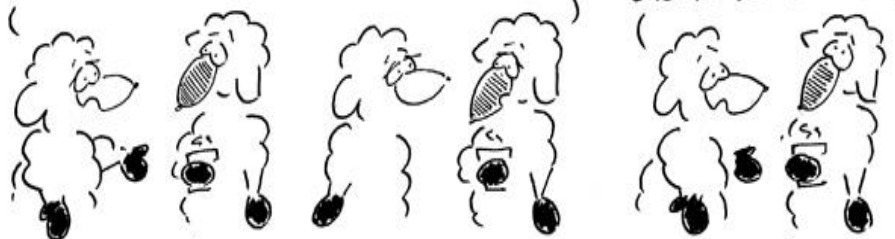
