Bible Reading: Read Mark 6:1-6

In our reading, we are told that Jesus was returning to his hometown in Nazareth. The news about his wise teachings and miraculous healings in other towns had preceded his arrival. Yet, this news did not make Jesus into a local hero. It was the opposite. The mind and heart of the people in his hometown were clouded by their judgement about Jesus' identity in the past. They remembered him as a poor carpenter. Even worst, they remembered him as a 'bastard'; a man whose father is not clearly identified. They called Jesus as the son of Mary even though it was the common practice to identify someone with his father. As the result, Jesus couldn't perform healing there. Indeed, people around us matter and if someone like Jesus needed to be surrounded by people who were supportive of him, how much more we all need people who support us. The slogan of our church is "where love and hope make a difference". We are to be a community where disapproving glare of judgement will diminish and be replaced by loving and nurturing expressions so that each of us can meet her full potential as a child of God.
