

Bible Reading: Psalm 15.

Psalm 15 was a part of the worship liturgy in the Jerusalem temple. In the opening part of the Psalm, people who entered the city of Jerusalem or the temple complex were asked: "Who may abide in God's tent? Who may dwell in the holy hill?" But the answer to the questions does not mention anything about the Jewish purity law. The Psalm answers the questions by declaring that those who can abide in God's presence are those who walk blamelessly and do what is right and speak the truth from their heart ..." (Psalm 15:2 NRSV) So, according to Psalm 15, the holy ones are not the ones who keep the purity laws—those who are concerned about the external features of their spiritual or religious life—but those whose 'walk' or whose 'disposition' in life is towards rightful living. Those are the ones who can 'dwell' or 'abide' in God's presence. I guess, we can also turn this around to say that God 'dwells' and 'abides' in and amongst those who live righteously and justly.
