**Bible Reading: Mark 10:17-27**

Unlike the religious leaders who often asked questions to Jesus to trap him, the young man in our reading was sincere: he genuinely wanted to know how to enter God's Kingdom. But, Jesus' answer did not satisfy him. It created even more questions in him. Like the wealthy young man, Jesus' answers may not always satisfy us either; his answers may create more questions in us. But that is OK. That may have been what Jesus intended in the first place. What we should be worried about is ready-made and simplistic answer that does not take our question seriously. That kind of answer only scratches the surface and does not go deep enough to deal with the root of the problem. Question, on the other hand, can lead us deeper and closer to the heart of God. It can deepen our faith. After all, some of Jesus' best teachings come from his dialogue with people who asked him questions, real questions.
