Bible Reading: Jeremiah 4:19-28

In our reading, Jeremiah used images from the creation poem in the first chapter of Genesis: light, humans, birds, and plants. But, this time, everything that God had created was unmade: the light had gone; human beings were no more; the birds of the air had disappeared, and plants were nowhere to be seen. In other words, the world had returned to its former condition in Genesis: a formless void. This destruction of creation, however, was not the result of natural disasters or the likes. Jeremiah claimed that the destruction that he envisioned was the result of the foolishness of his people, of their own evil doings. Indeed, the consistent message that we find throughout Jeremiah's book is this: true peace and security are found not in warhorses or chariots or swords, but in doing justice. Unless the people repented, destruction was inevitable, and it would engulf not only the nation, but also the entire creation itself.


