Bible Reading: Mark 10:2-16

At the heart of Jesus' teaching is always the wellbeing of God's people. From this perspective, we can see that at the heart of his teaching about divorce was his concern about the welfare of especially the women and the children who were, and still are, the most vulnerable parties in a divorce. So, Jesus invited people to see the broader implications of a divorce. For him, a marriage was not simply a legal contract between a man and a woman. In Genesis, the original intention of the union between a man and a woman is to find companionship. A divorce threatens that companionship. In other words, a divorce threatens the very wellbeing of the parties involved. So, the whole topic of divorce cannot and should not be reduced only to a 'yes' or 'no' answer. We are to approach it not with a rigid law, but with a discernment. Following Jesus' own direction, the main concern should always be about what is best for the wellbeing of the parties involved.
