The original audience of our reading from Isaiah were not Christians, but the Jewish people in exile and the remnants who stayed in Judah after the Babylonian invasion in 586 BC. So, the suffering servant in Isaiah was most likely the personification of the exiles in Babylon and the remnants in Judah either collectively or as individuals. But, yes, he can also be linked to Jesus. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus said that the role of the Son of Man is "to serve and to give his life a ransom for many (Mark 10:45 NRSV)." In other words, Jesus saw his mission as someone who would embody the suffering servant in Isaiah. In his death on the cross, Jesus indeed fulfilled this role. Just like the suffering servant in Isaiah, he too brought healing through his suffering on the cross. And if we proclaim that Jesus is the incarnation of God, then we dare to say that this is how God operates in the world. Our God is not an indifferent God; our God takes the pain of the world to bring wholeness to people.




Meet the President-Elect



At the 17th Assembly in July, Rev Dr Paul Goh was elected as the next President of the Uniting Church in Australia. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.
