Bible Reading: Philippians 4:4-7

How many times do we think that our joy will come from material possession? But we all know how fleeting the feeling of joy that we get from material thing is. The poet, Robert Burns, captured this reality when he said, "Pleasures are like poppies spread—You seize the flower, its bloom is shed." So where else can we find joy—especially the everlasting joy that we all want? Paul's letter to the Philippians can help us. In his letter, Paul did not ask the Philippians to rejoice only in good times. He asked them to be joyful regardless of the situation they were in. Paul then related this joy to the way the Philippians treated one another. He asked them to be gentle to one another. In the New Testament Greek, gentleness is about the way we behave towards other people, especially the way we use power in relation to others (Holly Hearon's Commentary on Philippians 4:4-7). To be gentle, then, is to use our power to bring out the best in others. Only when we do this, according to Paul, that we can truly rejoice in the Lord, always.

Candle of Joy A third candle pink one



The third Sunday in Advent (Advent III) shifts from a tone of expectation of Christ's coming to one of rejoicing at the arrival of God's kingdom with the coming of Jesus.

This candle, often called the Shepherd's Candle or the Joy Candle, represents joy, such as the joy the shepherds experienced when the angel told them that Christ was to be born. The Advent season is now half over, and Jesus' coming—both his first coming, liturgically, and his second coming, historically—is nearer now than it was two weeks ago.
