Reflection On Reading Jeremiah 14:7-10, 19-22.

Lament is a fundamental part of Israel's spirituality. On many occasions in the Scripture, the people of Israel openly express their disappointment on God.

We can see this in our reading today from the book of Jeremiah. Here, Jeremiah goes beyond orthodoxy. Here, he calls God not as a father or a shepherd, but as "a stranger in the land," "a traveler turning aside for the night," "someone confused," and even "a mighty warrior who cannot give help" (Jeremiah 14:8-9 NRSVU)! But, instead of seeing laments as sign of a breakdown in relationship between God and the people beyond redemption, laments are actually coming from the depth of the relationship between God and the people of Israel. The people express their disappointment towards God and hold God accountable because, deep down, they still care about God. No, the opposite of faith is not lament; the opposite of faith is indifference. No wonder that the laments in our reading in Jeremiah are done within the context of hope. Jeremiah closes the chapter by saying, "We set our hope on you, for it is you who do all this (Jeremiah 14:22 NRSVU)." . (Rev. Toby Keva)

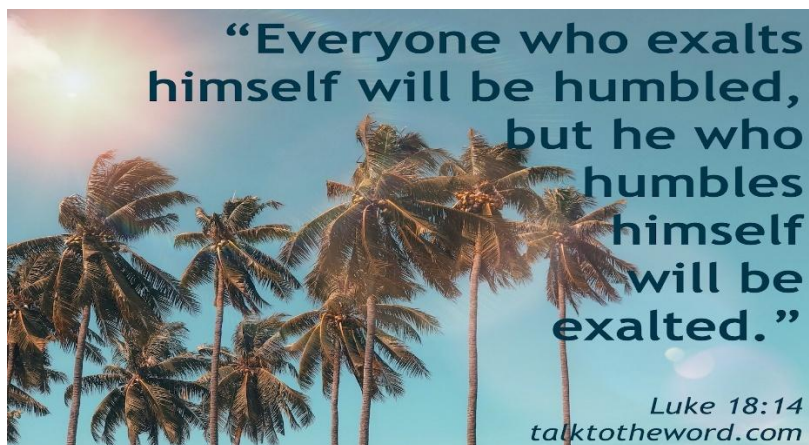

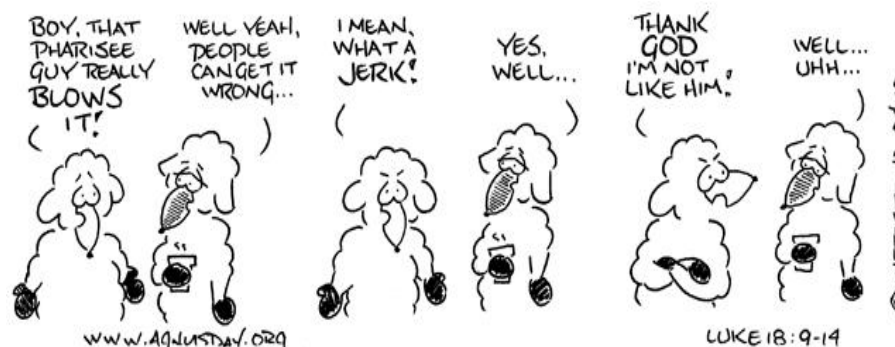
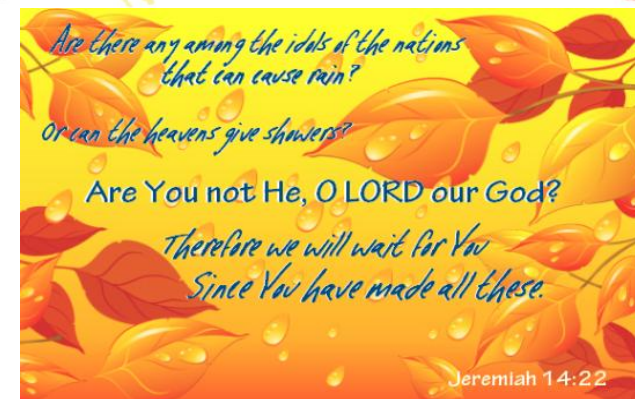


Prayer for the Week from 26 October 2025

He also told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."
