

Reflection On Bible 1 Timothy 6:6-19

The letter to Timothy warns us about the peril of pursuing wealth to find contentment. The letter is quite clear on one thing: contentment cannot be found by accumulating wealth because the *love* of money, the letter proclaims, is the source of all evil (1 Tim. 6:10)! So where do we find lasting contentment in life? For the letter of Timothy, there is a great correlation between *contentment* and *godliness*. But what does *godliness* even mean? It means to be like the God whom we worship; to take the characters of God and to do what God does. It means we are to “pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness ... do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share ... (1 Tim. 6:11, 18 NRSV).” Only when we do all these things that we will have lasting contentment in life or, in the words of the letter to Timothy, will we take hold of the life that really is life (1 Tim. 6:19 NRSV). In other words, only by doing these that we will truly live! . (Rev. Toby Keva)
