

#### Reflection On Reading : Luke 12:49-56.

The Romans had their own idea of peace: they called it Pax Romana or. roughly. Roman Peace. They claimed that their empire had brought peace and prosperity to the people they conquered. They had freed those people from their own barbarianism and backwardness. But Pax Romana was built on suppression. Death on the cross was the most prominent fate of those who dared to challenge the Empire's might. Indeed, if peace is built upon injustice and inequality and brutality, then that peace is not worth attaining. Peace that is built without the foundation of justice, dignity, and equity is not peace at all. That's why Jesus said that he came not to bring peace, but fire. Nothing is too sacred that God's fire cannot burn. God's fire purifies even our most valued and sacred institution and ideal. Jesus did not come to bring world peace. Jesus came to proclaim the Realm of God that unmasks what the world calls as peace. So, let us commit ourselves to achieve true and everlasting peace: a peace that is built upon the foundation of justice and righteousness; a peace that is built upon truth: a peace that is the reflection of God's Realm here on earth as it is in heaven.
