There is a **meeting** for all the **Elders** this **Sunday, 1st February** at **10.45 am** in the front office area.

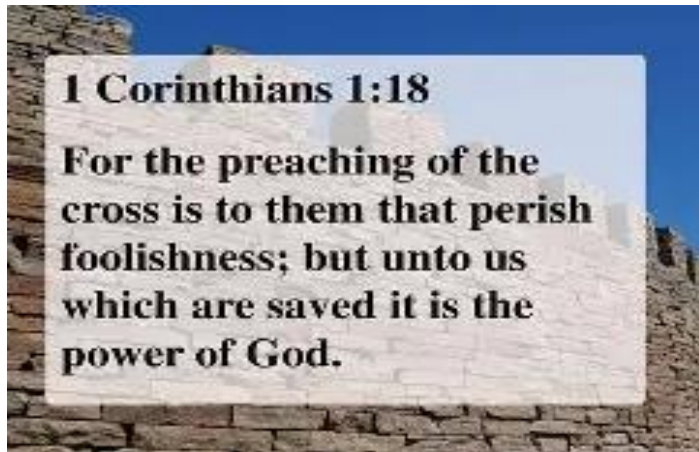

Reflection On Reading: Matthew 5:1-12, Psalm 15, Micah 6:1-8

Our readings come from the prophetic stream in the Bible that espouses ethical living, not religious conformity, as the path towards being right before God. It is this prophetic tradition that Jesus continued in his own ministry. For Jesus, just like for the prophets, to be right with God means to be right with other people. Indeed, at the heart of our Bible readings is the question, "Who is good enough in the eyes of God?" The question that Jesus tries to answer is, "Whom does the Kingdom of Heaven belong to?" For the author of Psalm 15, the question is, "Who can dwell in the house of the Lord"? For the prophet Micah, it is the question, "Who can come to the presence of God?" The answer is unequivocal: the person whom the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to; the person who can dwell in the house of the Lord; the person who can be in the presence of God's holiness without being consumed is not someone who is religiously pious; or someone who gives the most wealth or time during public worship; or someone who strictly follows religious laws without fail. No, the person whom God honours the most is the person who lives righteously; the person who treats another person well as a fellow human being. **(Rev. Toby Keva)**

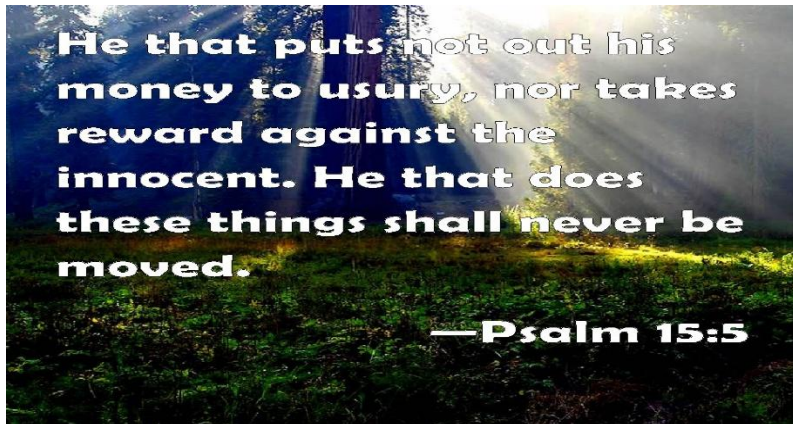
