

## Reflection On Reading: Matthew 5:13-20

Jesus addressed people in ancient time where the things that we take for granted in modern life; the things that many of us would like to have less of, were items that people in Jesus' time couldn't live without. For example, in his time, light—artificial light—was not as abundant and excessive as it is today. People thus were very appreciative of anything that could bring light into darkness, especially at night-time. Lamp, therefore, was essential because, without it, people would be left in complete darkness at night. Salt, another example, was used not only for cooking, but also for preserving food—there was no such thing as a refrigerator back then. So, when Jesus talked about salt and lamp, he talked about items that were essential in his time. Salt and lamp were the 'must-have' items in every household at the time. To be the salt and the light of the world, therefore, is not something that Jesus' followers can omit. People in the world would suffer and die without Jesus' followers being the salt and the light of the world. The teaching about being the salt and the light of the world is thus not an advice or suggestion; it is a commandment from Jesus; it is a requirement for those who follow him. **(Rev. Toby Keva)**






